Where you are acting on behalf of another (i.e. a Representative), the nature of the representation is a matter to be agreed between you and the importer/exporter.

However, as a Representative, you must be in a position to produce to Revenue on demand evidence of your authority to act as such. While there is no specific format laid down in the Code in relation to such authority, Revenue would expect that the authority would be in accordance with the specimens attached to this Notice.

Appointment of a Customs Clearance Agent to act as a Direct Representative
